Continent		A large landmass on Earth (e.g., Asia, Africa).
Ocean		A vast body of saltwater covering much of Earth (e.g., Pacific Ocean).
Equator		An imaginary line dividing the Earth into Northern and Southern Hemispheres.
Hemisphere		Half of the Earth, either Northern, Southern, Eastern, or Western.
Climate		The typical weather conditions of a place over a long period.
Environment		The surroundings in which plants, animals, and people live
Island		A piece of land surrounded by water.
Mountain		A large natural elevation of the Earth's surface
Globe		A spherical representation of the Earth.
Population		The number of people living in a particular area.
Natural Resource		Materials found in nature that are useful to humans (e.g., water, forests).
